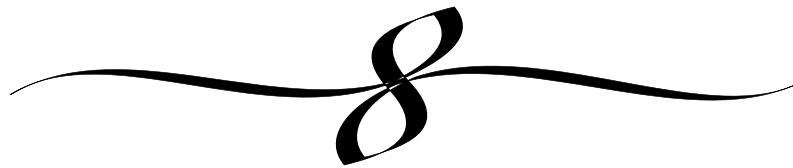

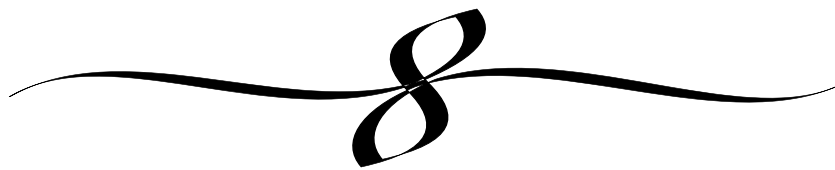

CONSTITUTION

Tee S. Gatewood, Pastor-elect for the Arbor Dale Presbyterian Church, preached on “Praise the Lord” with Scripture taken from Psalm 146:1-10. Jason Bryant, Pastor-elect for First Presbyterian Church, Mount Holly, preached on, “Abiding with Him” with Scripture taken from John 14:15-21. Mike Sears, Pastor-elect for Olney Presbyterian Church, preached on, “Consider Your Call,” with Scripture taken from I Corinthians 1:26-2:5.

The service of worship concluded with the celebration of the Lord’s Supper led by Pastors McClurg and Haak, with communion served by the elders of the Montreat Presbyterian Church.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY
I. WORK OF THE COMMITTEE

The Rev. Dr. James Bernhardt, Moderator of the Committee on Ministry, reported on the actions taken by the Committee on Ministry on behalf of the Presbytery. (Appendix E) Dr. Bernhardt recognized Pastor Ronald Gilmer, who has moved to a new Presbytery, thanking him for his ministry in our Presbytery and praying God’s blessing on him in his future service in the Church. He also recognized the Rev. Ellen Dozier, who has requested honorable retirement, thanking her for her ministry in our Presbytery and in Guatemala and praying God’s blessing on her for the future.

Dr. Bernhardt, on behalf of the Committee on Ministry, recommended that the Rev. Jack Davidson, from the Presbyterian Church in America, be accepted as a member of the Presbytery of Western North Carolina, and (pursuant to *BO: G-11.0404.a(2)*) that the Presbytery exempt him from the requirement for ordination examinations. The motion was passed by the required two-thirds majority and Pastor Davidson was welcomed to the Presbytery of Western North Carolina.

COMMITTEE ON MINISTRY

Dr. Bernhardt introduced Jason D. Bryant, Pastor-elect of the First Presbyterian Church, Mt. Holly, coming to the Presbytery of Western North Carolina from the Presbytery of Charlotte. Following questions and answers, Dr. Bernhardt moved, on behalf of the Committee on Ministry, that he be ordained and installed by the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. The motion passed and Dr. Bernhardt offered prayer. Representatives from the First Presbyterian Church, Mt. Holly were recognized.

Chairman Bernhardt introduced Tee S. Gatewood, III, Pastor-elect of the Arbor Dale Presbyterian Church, coming to the Presbytery of Western North Carolina from the Flint River Presbytery. Following questions and answers, Dr. Bernhardt moved, on behalf of the Committee on Ministry, that he be ordained and installed by the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. The motion passed and Dr. Bernhardt offered prayer. Representatives from the Arbor Dale Presbyterian Church were recognized.

Dr. Bernhardt introduced Michael S. Sears, Pastor-elect of the Olney Presbyterian Church, from the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. Following questions and answers, Dr. Bernhardt moved, on behalf of the Committee on Ministry, that he be ordained and installed by the Presbytery of Western North Carolina. The motion passed and Dr. Bernhardt offered prayer. Representatives from the Olney Presbyterian Church were recognized.

The Rev. Bobbi White, General Presbyter, presented each of the approved candidates with a Guatemalan stole on behalf of the Committee on Preparation for Ministry as a welcome to the Presbytery.

On behalf of the Committee on Ministry, the Rev. Dr. Bill Sweetser, Jr., co-moderator of the Examinations Committee, introduced the following new ministers in the Presbytery. Rev. Terry Alexander, pastor of the Newland Presbyterian Church and a member of the General Assembly's Advocacy Committee for Women's Concerns, brought greetings from that Committee. The ACWC is funded and supported through the Office of the Executive Director of the General Assembly Council. Staff support is provided by the Racial Ethnic and Women's Ministries program area, PC(USA). Pastor Alexander shared the concerns of the committee about their work.

GRANDFATHER HOME FOR CHILDREN

Mr. Jim Swinkola, President, brought greetings from Grandfather Home for Children. He expressed his sincere thanks for the Presbytery's support, gifts, and prayers and asked the Presbytery to continue to pray for the children and the home.

MASSANETTA SPRINGS

The Rev. Dr. Fred Holbrook, Peaks Presbytery, brought greetings from Massanetta Springs Conference Center. He shared the mission and strategic plan for the conference center.

LEES-McRAE COLLEGE

Mrs. Mae Weed, Senior Assistant Director of Admissions and Church Relations, Lees-McRae College, brought greetings from the College. She expressed her thanks to the Presbytery for their support and prayers for the College.

PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

Ms. Patricia Clark, elder at First Presbyterian Church, Morganton, and Coordinator of Presbyterian Women for the Presbytery of Western North Carolina, thanked the Presbytery for their support. She shared the mission of Presbyterian Women and highlighted events that the Presbyterian Women have actively participated in. She also shared dates for upcoming events.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

The Rev. Eddie Deas, pastor of Third Street Presbyterian Church, Gastonia, offered intercessory prayers for those in the Presbytery and beyond. He gave thanks for those in attendance and for our break for nourishment. The Presbytery recessed for lunch at 11:58 a.m.

RECONVENE

Presbytery reconvened at 1:30 p.m. with an opportunity for Presbyterians to address the Presbytery with announcements, concerns and opinions.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL PRESBYTER

The Rev. Bobbi White, General Presbyter, talked about how we, as a Presbytery, are a mission field, with similarities to the days of the early church. We have been called to tell people about the Good News and to show them Christ's love and grace. She stated that most people come to church because they are personally invited and that sometimes it may require persons being invited several times before they will attend. She shared her concerns regarding the fact that we have lost worship attendants and members over the past years. Although we have lost members, some of our churches are growing in other ways that demonstrate God's love and grace. (Appendix F)

Special thanks were extended to the Rev. David Hosick for his leadership and years of service within the Presbytery. He will be the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in St. Petersburg, Florida (Presbytery of Tampa Bay).

The Montreat Conference Center and Montreat Presbyterian Church were recognized and thanked for their generous hospitality and services in making this Presbytery meeting have the feeling of being guided by the Holy Spirit. She reported that the Montreat Presbyterian Church is growing and they recognize themselves as a church without walls.

STRATEGIC GOALS COMMITTEE

The Rev. Dr. David Hosick, chair of the Strategic Goals Committee, reflected on the time spent together at the October 2007 Presbytery meeting working on the four questions that were presented with commissioners asked to record their responses. The committee received 139 completed forms. Following a series of meetings among the committee, an analysis of the questionnaires was compiled. (Appendix G). The committee will continue its work by further refining the questionnaire data. The committee will present a workshop on August 9, 2008 that will focus on how local churches can become more faithful and vital in their congregational life. Following this workshop, the committee will make another report at the October 2008 Presbytery Meeting.

GOOD NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES

The Rev. Terry Hanna, pastor at Bryson City Presbyterian Church, shared how that congregation of diverse people is sharing their faith in the community and their relationship with God. They are a congregation with deep roots and wings, and are an inclusive, friendly, loving and caring congregation.

The Rev. Dr. Wallace Johnson, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Hickory, shared that he is very grateful for a congregation that is open to new ministries and to the Presbytery for allowing him to share a slice of what they are doing in their church. Hickory, First has begun a third worship service on Sunday nights that is an outreach to homeless people and those seeking a new direction. Half of those attending the service are members of Hickory, First and the other half are seekers. During the summer, Hickory, First offers "Dinner and A Movie." This time of fellowship begins with a meal followed by reviewing movie clips and reflection from a theological aspect. Also, as a part of their outreach, the church sponsors a Soup Kitchen the second Sunday of each month, providing a hot meal for those who have no place to go for a hot meal.

HUNGER COMMITTEE

The Rev. Deborah McEachran, chair of the Hunger Committee, reported on the work of the committee. The Hunger Committee will be presenting Hunger Awareness Training Events within the clusters of the Presbytery during the fall. She encouraged all the churches to attend one of these events and become aware of hunger issues in the world.

Pastor McEachran and the Rev. Wirt Skinner presented a short skit that could also be given to a congregation to make more people aware of hunger issues.

MISSIONS COMMITTEE

The Rev. Dr. Kevin Frederick, chair of the Missions Committee, announced that Ginnie Stevens, Associate for Missions, retired March 31, 2008 and acknowledged that the big challenge for the committee is to sustain the work of missions without Ginnie. Remarking that, "Ginnie is a hard act to follow," he urged the congregations to spread their mission giving through the year, rather than waiting until year's end.

Missionaries to Sudan, Del and Debbie Braaksma, will be visiting in Western North Carolina July 24-29, 2008. They will be speaking in various areas of the Presbytery and will be completing their visit with the Presbytery at our July 29 meeting.

Dr. Frederick introduced the Mission Team going to Malawi in May. Assisting with the commissioning of the Malawi Mission Team were Rev. Allen Huff and Rev. James Bernhardt. Pastor Huff charged the team to take with them the love and compassion of the Lord Jesus Christ, and reminded them to remember that each one had been called for this trip, that they were loved, and that the Presbytery would be praying for them as they traveled.

Dr. Frederick shared with the Presbytery that the Rev. Ellen Dozier will be retiring the end of May, 2008, and that the denomination will be searching for someone to replace her. He gave thanks to the 76 churches within this Presbytery for their support through money and prayer for the mission work of our denomination.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS TO SYNOD

The Rev. Dr. James Aydelotte, Stated Clerk, reported on highlights from the March 2008 meeting of the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic. He referred the Presbytery to the written reports in their packets from Elder Larry Poe and the Rev. Sue Burton. The reports were accepted with appreciation. (Appendix H)

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Elder Richard Graham, chair of the Nominating Committee, presented the following recommendation for Presbytery approval:

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT should there be a vacancy among the commissioners to the 2008 (218th) General Assembly, the Presbytery authorize its Nominating Committee to nominate, and its Coordinating Council to elect, on behalf of Presbytery, a new commissioner.

Following a brief explanation, the recommendation was approved.

Dr. Graham then presented the recommendation of the Rev. Dr. Martin “Luke” Harkey as a commissioner representative to the 218th General Assembly as a replacement for the Rev. David Hosick. Pastor Harkey was duly elected.

Dr. Graham then presented the recommendations for committee vacancies and moved the approval of the Nominating Committee Report. (Appendix I) All were duly elected.

COORDINATING COUNCIL

On behalf of the Coordinating Council, Elder Phil Dammann, presented for approval recommendations 1 through 3. James Aydelotte, Stated Clerk, gave a brief overview of recommendation 1. The recommendations were approved.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. **THAT the proposed “Standing Rules,” which will be effective January 1, 2009, be approved. (1st of 2 decisions) (Appendix J)**
(Background: These “Standing Rules,” will replace the old “Organization Manual,” which is out-of-date. This change must be approved at two Presbytery meetings. This is the first reading for approval.)
2. **THAT the changes in the Terms of Call for the Rev. Dr. James Aydelotte, Stated Clerk, be approved.**
THAT at the request of James Aydelotte, \$2,500 of his housing allowance be reallocated to auto allowance. This request in no way changes the total package received by the Stated Clerk, and this is no additional cost to the Presbytery.

4. **THAT Ike Kennerly has retired from his work as part-time Interim Associate Presbyter, effective Feb. 29, 2008. Although, he will continue his work as Stated Supply at Etowah. Bobbi White will be looking to find a person(s) to fill that position. Ginnie Stevens retired as Associate for Missions effective March 31, 2008. She will continue to serve the Presbytery as Guatemala Partnership Coordinator.**
5. **THAT the Council approved a recommendation from the Peace and Justice Committee noting that half the work of communication is listening and that time be set aside at some Presbytery Meetings for this important work.**
6. **THAT the Council has endorsed the recommendation of the Conover Administrative Commission, calling Frank and Anne Aichinger as co-organizing pastors/evangelists to the Conover New Church Development and the action of the Committee on Ministry in appointing them to this position. Technically, NCD organizing pastors are employees of Presbytery, because a new church development is not an officially “organized church.” The General Assembly has committed \$100,000 over a seven year period to help us fund the Conover New Church Development.**
7. **THAT the Missions Committee was granted permission to sponsor a special event entitled, “Bowling for Burleson,” to raise funds for a school building in Nkhoma, Malawi. The event is scheduled for Friday, May 9, 2008 from 6 - 9 p.m. at the AMF Gastonia Lanes in Gastonia.**
8. **THAT the Coordinating Council approved writing a letter of greetings and solidarity to Sur Occidente Presbytery to be delivered by Judy Nebrig when she attends the meeting on April 19, 2008.**
9. **THAT a list of upcoming events of the Presbytery can be found on the back of the Presbytery Docket.**
10. **Attached are current prayer requests. (Appendix L)**
