SOME OF THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PRESBYTERY MEETING

WORSHIP AND COMMUNION, WITH DR. BARBARA NAGY BRINGING THE MESSAGE.

BARBARA NAGY'S REPORT ABOUT THE HEALTH CARE SITUATION IN NKHOMA HOSPITAL AND THE SURROUNDING AREA. Barbara has exciting words to share about the improvements at the hospital and the potential to reduce infant mortality, not only at Nkhoma, but throughout all of Malawi and beyond. Listen to things done as a result of this Presbytery's support of Barbara, the hospital, and the new school.

CELEBRATION OF FIFTEEN YEARS OF PARTNERSHIP WITH GUATEMALA AND THE RENEWAL OF ANOTHER FIVE YEAR COVENANT. During the Presbytery meeting, we will celebrate the fifteen years of partnership with our two partner presbyteries, Suchitepequez and Sur Occidente. We will have the opportunity to hear from representatives from each of the two presbyteries, Edwin Gelista and Cesar Taracena. Hear about some of the things God has done in our partnership together.

We will celebrate the signing of a new five year covenant and will commission teams going to Guatemala.

BIBLE STUDY TOGETHER. We will be exploring scripture together as we listen for God's voice. We will use the Lectio Divina method, an ancient and modern method. It focuses on hearing God speak through scripture.

GOOD NEWS FROM CHURCHES. At each presbytery meeting, several churches are asked to share good news of what God is doing in their midst. Hopefully, this will open our eyes to look for God's work in our midst and also get ideas that can be used.

HEALTH CARE UPDATE. Health Care is a critical and contentious issue in our country about which Christians will disagree. However, each of us need to be informed and ask the question, "How do we as Christians understand and respond to our own health care needs and those of our neighbors?" Dr. Olson Huff, a nationally known pediatric doctor and elder at the Montreat Presbyterian Church, will give us an update on this important topic. We are not trying to get a consensus on this issue. This is intended as a listening session on an issue that is critical to our country, and we hope it will also offer us an opportunity to achieve a deeper understanding that is vital to our faith.

The health theme, as well as the mission theme, runs through our Presbytery meeting. Dr. Barbara Nagy will be reporting on health care in Malawi. One of the mission outreaches in the Guatemalan Partnership is health. Clean water is also a health concern.

FINALLY, FOR FUN AND PURE ENJOYMENT, WE CONTINUE THE TRADITION OF A SPONTANEOUS HOE DOWN AND SING ALONG.

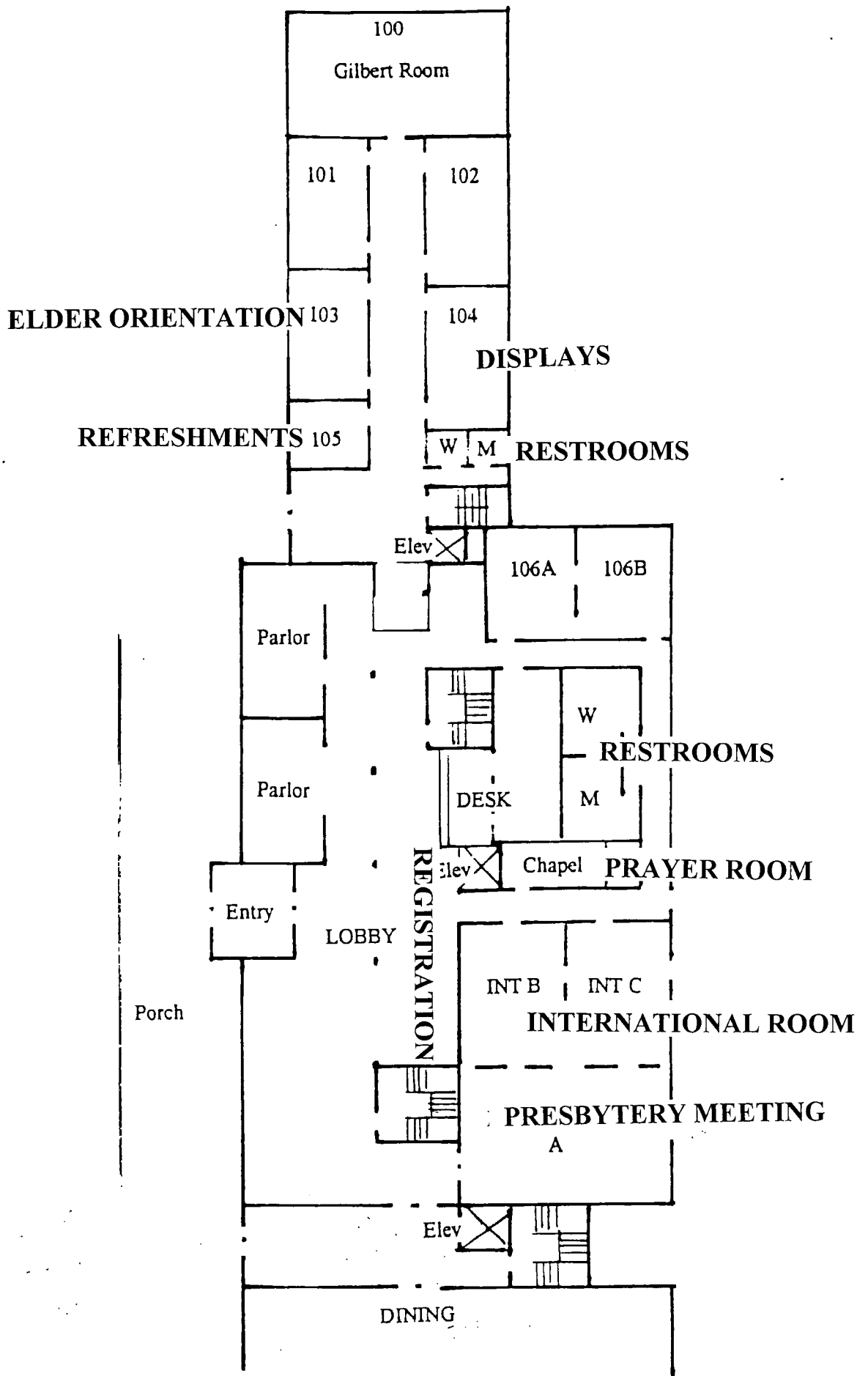
